#### **Vaccine Information**

We would like to encourage all residents, resident family members, and staff to take advantage of the newly available COVID-19 booster. This is a critical step we can take to protect ourselves and our loved ones. We all are experiencing COVID fatigue. However, the virus remains a serious public health issue and outbreaks within the nursing home affect our social programs and the quality of life for our residents. The latest booster, known as the bivalent booster, was developed to provide better protection against the currently circulating Omicron variant. Please contact your resident's nurse to complete the consent needed to administer the shot for your loved one. We urge you to contact your local pharmacy or your medical provider to get the shot for yourselves.
